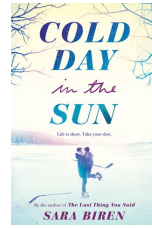
Michigan vs. the Boys by Carrie Allen

A naturally talented runner and troublemaker is recruited for an elite middle school track team. He must stay on track, literally and figuratively, to reach his full potential.



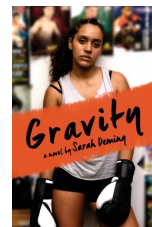
Cold Day in the Sun by Sara Biren
Holland Delviss, the only girl on the boys high school hockey team, is forced to confront gender role expectations and self-doubts when she is selected to be featured during HockeyFest.



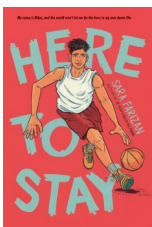
Throw Like a Girl by Sarah Henning
