3D Guidelines

3D print requests must follow the Library's policies that have been approved by the Greenwood Public Library Board of Trustees. (http://www.greenwoodlibrary.us/policies).

The library reserves the right to refuse a 3D print request.

3D Printing Procedures

- Persons wanting to use the 3D printer must <u>fill out our print reservation form</u> and submit a
 *.stl
 - formatted file on a flash drive or SD card. Files must be able to print in 5 hours or less.
- Staff will add the file to the print queue after being readied for printing using the printer's software. The library will review all files with the customer prior to printing.
- Items may be picked up at the Library during regular hours. It is sometimes difficult to estimate exact printing times. Library staff will make an educated guess about the length of the job upon request. You will be contacted when the object is ready to be picked up.
- Items not picked up will become property of the library and placed on display after 30 days.
- No more than 1 print request per patron, per week.
- We cannot promise specific colors will be available. Colors change on a regular basis. If you
 have a specific color request for your item, we will do our best to accommodate you. Objects
 print in <u>one</u> solid color.
- Currently there is no cost for 3D printing at the Library. This policy may change at any time. If
 you have questions, please speak with a staff member prior to undertaking your project or send
 an email to aparsons@greenwoodlibrary.us.
- Please note that 3D printing procedures are subject to change.
